Lone Working	Injuries - Drowning, falls, electrocution, cuts, concussion, sudden illness resulting serious injury or death and no one to raise alarm.	<p>Responsible person on site to be aware of where the work is taking place and ensure they are updated when the work is completed.</p> <p>Workers to ensure someone knows of their whereabouts. Ensure they have the phone number for Responsible person on site, or if external, employer knows of working location.</p> <p>Workers carry a working mobile phone with them. – To be contactable by Responsible person or external employer.</p> <p>Avoid working alone on the site in adverse weather conditions.</p> <p>No working at height, heavy manual handling, or tasks involving use of hazardous machinery / equipment when working alone.</p> <p>Contractors working on site should provide a method statement for the work they will undertake.</p>	Med	<p>Lone working to be discouraged where possible.</p> <p>If still necessary, then control measures to be followed.</p>	Low
